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Value-Based Services Update

The Premier Health Group Board meeting was held on February 25 and we would like to share a few updates from this meeting. Beginning with a few accomplishments from 2020:

Bundle Payment for Care Improvement - Advanced (BPCIA)

- Coordinated efforts in the development of the BPCIA Skilled Nursing Facility Performance Network based on qualitative and quantitative data with the focus on care redesign
- Development of BPCIA Hospital Based Committees that review site-specific data to determine required actions for modifications in operations

Premier Health Group (PHG) and the Clinically Integrated Network (CIN)

- Successfully began recruiting provider groups for participation in the CIN
- Working with Front Health data analytics, claims data for current value contracts can be analyzed
- Reducing variation in care through evidence-based care paths being developed (currently respiratory, sepsis, UTI, and others based on opportunities identified)
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Looking ahead to the future, we have identified four strategies that PHG will focus on.

1. Build market distinctiveness

- a. An emphasis on growing attributed lives and total cost of care management through the CIN
- b. Develop integrative care models with aligned specialists across key services lines

2. Advance physician partnership and alignment

- a. Through the creation and effective execution of the CIN, align providers in a provider-centric revenue driven model and a patient-centric care model attaining the quadruple aim of higher quality care, lower cost, with enhanced patient experience and physician satisfaction
- b. Jointly contract with major purchasers in the market (e.g., payors, employers, CMS) on value-based care contracts
- c. Work toward steps to provide independent provider groups with analytic dashboard access and determine data flow required from provider groups

3. Reimagine consumer engagement and experience

- a. Design and deploy clinical performance improvement initiatives focused on shared quality, access and patient satisfaction goals
- b. Establish seamless electronic scheduling functionality to enable better patient access to specialists

4. Drive industry-leading productivity

- a. Share clinical and claims data across value-based care contracts to enable more effective patient management across the continuum of care
- b. Maintain current care redesign process through BPCIA with current providers


COVID-19 Clinical Update: February 26

Premier Health hospitals came out of a Code Yellow for COVID in mid-February, but we are still in a national public health emergency for COVID-19. Additionally, most counties in Ohio are in a level 3 Public Emergency, indicating very high exposure and spread. View Ohio Public Health Advisory System here. All of these initiatives are still in place at Premier Health hospitals, even for those individuals who have received the COVID-19 vaccine:

Universal Masking:

- Everyone must still wear a mask when in any of our facilities. The only exceptions are when you are eating or alone in a private office.
- As a reminder, we must maintain distance in breakrooms and other gathering areas when masks are removed.
- Currently, we are NOT recommending double masking. We encourage you to be familiar with ensuring a good fit with the appropriate style mask. For more information, view the CDC Guide to Masks.





There is no change in our screening at this point even for individuals who have received vaccines. It has not been demonstrated that vaccines fully prevent infection thus screening will continue for now. This decision may change later this year as more data becomes available. We will continue our current process of swabbing patients upon admission and as part of pre-admission testing.

COVID-19 Vaccine Clinics

We would like to make you aware that later this evening we will begin scheduling eligible Ohioans to receive COVID-19 vaccinations. These clinics will be held on the following dates:

Monday, March 15: UD Arena, 8:30 am to 5:30 pm - *vaccine clinic operated by Miami Valley Hospital*

Tuesday, March 16: Countryside YMCA, 8:30 am to 5:30 pm - *vaccine clinic operated by Atrium Medical Center*

Current State of Ohio vaccine eligibility criteria

All Ohioans age 50 and older are now eligible to be vaccinated. The governor also expanded eligibility for people younger than age 50 based on occupation and qualifying medical conditions.

New Eligibility by Occupation

- Child Care Services
- Funeral Services
- Law Enforcement and Corrections Officers
- Firefighters

New Eligibility by Medical Condition

- Women who are pregnant
- People with amyotrophic lateral sclerosis (ALS)
- Bone marrow transplant recipients
- People with type 1 diabetes
- People with type 2 diabetes
- People with end-stage renal disease
